## DROP-OFF/PICK-UP

Extended care is included in your registration – no extra fees!

Early drop-off for campers begins at 7:30 AM. It is mandatory that each camper be signed in by an adult each morning. Parents and guardians are welcome to temporarily park in the circle located in front of the Aquarium and escort their camper to the table located outside of the business entrance. If a cruise ship is in port, please review the Aquarium parking lot instructions and detailed information in the email sent a week prior to your camper's session.

Campers must be personally signed out by a listed adult, showing a valid ID, each afternoon. Parents and guardians may temporarily park in the circle located in front of the Aquarium to sign out their camper at the table outside of the business entrance. Please note that the latest pick up is 5:30 PM, after which time the Aquarium reserves the right to charge \$5 per minute until the camper is signed out.

Please inform camp staff if your camper needs to be picked up early (before 4 PM) or will be dropped off late (after 9 AM). Contact camp staff if the camper will be picked up by someone other than the person noted on the sign-in sheet. If your camper will be absent for the day, please call the camp phone line. The camp phone line is (813) 606-4435 and only operates during camp hours, but you may leave a message outside of these hours.

## HEALTH AND SAFETY

Please know that Aquarium staff will implement safety measures that are most appropriate at the time of camp. This may include a daily health statement from the parent/guardian. Our goal is to provide the safest possible experience based on the most current guidelines.

## BUDDIES

Children who have completed kindergarten through grade 3, or who are 6-9 years old, have the option of choosing a weekly buddy that is in the same grade/age range. Please be advised that classes of completed kindergarten through grade 1 or grades 2-3 may run simultaneously in different rooms due to camp capacities. If your child would like to be in the same class as a friend/relative of the same grade/age, please make sure the buddy name is listed on the online registration form. You may only choose one buddy per week; however, the buddy does not have to be the same for multiple weeks.

## T-SHIRTS

All campers will receive one t-shirt on the first day of camp. Campers will receive one shirt for the summer. Additional t-shirts will be available for purchase for \$20. Sizes include children: XS (3-4), S (4-6), M (8-10), L (12-14) and adult: S, M, L, XL, and XXL.





## OPEN WATER SCUBA

**SPECIAL AGE REQUIREMENT: 12–15 YEARS OLD**  
**June 3–14 (Monday-Friday, 2 Weeks), \$1,200**

The SCUBA adventure begins with the SeaTREK experience at the Aquarium. Earn an Open Water NAUI SCUBA Diver certification\* through classroom and pool training provided by a certified NAUI SCUBA instructor from The Florida Aquarium Marine Operations staff. Open water certification dives will take place over two days (weather permitting). After SCUBA certification, campers will have an opportunity to dive at the Aquarium. Campers must pass a basic swimming test and provide their own SCUBA-quality mask, snorkel, fins, booties, wetsuit, weights, and weight belt. All other gear and study materials are included. Waiver and study materials will be given to parents during the required SCUBA information session (date to follow in confirmation packet). All waivers must be turned in before May 17, 2024. Campers with asthma, breathing conditions, ear tubes, or other medical conditions must provide doctor's approval. Because of special arrangements, no refunds can be given after May 20, 2024, including refunds for medical conditions.

\*SCUBA certification is not guaranteed. Only those who successfully complete all requirements and demonstrate skills will be certified.

- Full payment is due at the time of registration. Checks and credit cards are accepted.

## CANCELLATION, CHANGE & REFUND POLICY:

- Cancellations\* received two weeks (14 days) before the start date of the camp session will result in a 75% refund. Cancellations made 13 days or less before the start date of the camp session will not be refunded.
- All cancellations must be given in writing by email to [education@flaquarium.org](mailto:education@flaquarium.org).
- Camp session transfers can be accommodated if space is available. 25% of the session fee will be charged for all transfers.
- You will receive a confirmation letter via email within two weeks of registration. If you do not receive this, call (813) 273-4015 for more information.
- The Florida Aquarium reserves the right to separate or combine camps.
- No refunds will be given due to inclement weather. This includes, but is not limited to: hurricanes, tropical storms, and Florida heat.

\*As noted on page 8, because of special arrangements required for SCUBA Camp, no refunds can be given for that camp after May 20, 2024, including refunds for medical conditions.

## INCLEMENT WEATHER

- Summer can be a time of afternoon thundershowers and all-day downpours. There may be times that plans are altered, especially for travel camps. In these instances, the Aquarium has rainy day plans and will make decisions for the safety of campers. We make every effort to resume our plans as soon as possible.
