Designed for middle and high school science teachers, this interactive experience will deepen your understanding of the biology, ecology, and physiology of these ecosystems—and why they are critical to the health and resilience of our coastal environment.

Through this interactive workshop, teachers will participate in STEM activities and receive related curricula and stewardship opportunities for their classrooms.
